LICENSING

INITIAL LICENSE

- Resident
1. Complete 20 hours pre-licensing course per line of authority
Courses found at <http://www.sircon.com/minnesota>
 2. Schedule exam at www.psiexams.com. Take and pass exam.
 3. Get Fingerprinted. If you take your exam at a PSI Exam test center you will be fingerprinted there.
 4. After passing exam and fingerprints submitted apply for license at www.sircon.com/Minnesota
- Non-Resident: Apply at www.sircon.com/minnesota (must be in good standing in home state)

RENEWALS

- Resident and Non-Resident: www.sircon.com/minnesota
Residents need to have 24 hours, with 3 in ethics, of CE completed at least 30 days before license expires. Available courses can be found at www.sircon.com/minnesota

CONTINUING EDUCATION

RESIDENT LICENSE CE'S: 24 hours, with 3 being in ethics, at time of renewals. Courses can be found at www.sircon.com/minnesota

LONG TERM CARE CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

All resident license holders wishing to sell Long Term Care, Long term Care-Partnership, and Med Supp must complete the following courses: (all count towards your state license CE requirements)

1. Initial 8 hour LTC partnership Course, online or classroom, must include MN Medicaid information
2. 4 hours of Renewal LTC courses every two years from date of initial 8 hour course. Online or classroom option.

Non residents must be compliant in their home state AND take a MN 2 hour course in order to write LTC. However, knowledge of Medicaid and Medicaid assistance for MN is required. Non-residents' home state requirements may be counted towards the 2 hour requirement. Need to confirm with insurance carrier.
